#### Continuing Care of the Polytrauma Patient

##### MODULE SUMMARY

This module is suitable for nurses and other healthcare professionals who provide continuing care to polytrauma patients in the acute ward setting.

It will allow practitioners to deepen their knowledge of the physical and psychological effects major trauma has on patients and to explore the evidence-base for care.
