## **Professional and research activities of Professor Dr. Philip Anderson**

From autumn 1994 to autumn 2007 worked as a freelance researcher on migration issues based in Munich, Germany. Main areas of research: the situation of Muslims in Germany; intercultural competence; the social and human rights of the undocumented, studies in London (Jesuit Refugee Service, 1999) and in Munich (Munich municipality, 2003); care of the dying (report 2005); elderly migrants in Germany (report for Caritas and City of Munich 2008); migrants with disability (report for Munich City Council 2009). Ongoing lectures and seminars for professional practice in the social, educational and migration fields as well as support in an advisory capacity. Since October 2007 Professorship for Migration and Intercultural Social Work in the Social and Health Sciences Faculty of the University of Applied Sciences in Regensburg, Germany. Current research project (since 2012): Integration of young asylum seekers and refugees into the vocational training system. 2016: Project Report for City of Munich with wide-ranging recommendations on integration of asylum seekers into the vocational training (Dual) system in Germany.
